Who are we?

Briefly, we're a family-run certified organic farm located in Portugal Cove. We've been growing organically for over 30 years, providing leadership in sustainable farming on the Avalon Peninsula. To a great extent, we have fulfilled our original goals which were to demonstrate that most vegetables can be grown in Newfoundland, to encourage local food production and to serve a local market at a time when organic vegetables were literally non-existent. Our new and most pressing goal is to break even so the farm can be sustained when we are no longer able to be the Shepherds.

What's a CSA?

Our Veggie Group is a CSA, a Community Supported Agriculture model. It's a way for you to connect with us, a local farm, and to know where your food comes from, that it is local, seasonal and fresh, and to help share the risks and the rewards of farming. We've had great years and we've had challenging ones – one never knows in Newfoundland, but we are always hopeful that there will be enough produce to exceed the cost of membership.

The birth of the Veggie Group (formerly Veggie Co-op) took place over thirty years ago. Mike was invited to give a talk on organics at Memorial University. The students who organized the event, asked "How can we get your vegetables?". Knowing that most did not have transportation to the farm, Mike promised if they could get 30 people interested in buying vegetables, he would deliver a weekly bag of veggies at the MUN Science Building Parking Lot. They did and he did!

When do we start? How many weeks?

We'll begin a **14 week season** starting June 19th with a 3 holiday week option for a **total of 17 weeks**. If the weather does not cooperate, the first Veggie delivery will occur on June 26th and we'll have a 2 holiday week option. Members who provide us with advanced notice (at least 1 week) will have a replacement week(s) at the end of the season. For example, if you need to miss one week, you'll receive a bag on Week 15; if you need 2 holiday weeks, you'll receive bags on Weeks 15 and 16 as a replacement. If there is sufficient product, members who do not miss any of the regular season weeks can opt to buy additional weeks at the end of the season.

What are the membership options available and price?

We offer 3 types of membership: large bag, small bag, part-time:

Larger bag: \$714 (14 weeks) - \$51.00/week average

Smaller bag: \$546 (14 weeks) - \$39/week average

How does the pricing work?

Each item in your bag will be listed and a total provided, much like the sales receipt at the super market. Early in the year, the total for the vegetables in the bag will usually be *less than* the \$39.00 or \$51.00 weekly cost you have paid for. Around the first to middle of August, the total will start to *increase*, until it evens out. Later in the fall, the bags will be bursting with vegetables. Hopefully, near the end of the season, there will be winter squash, pumpkin, beets, rutabaga, and parsnip.

What kind of produce will be in the bag?

We hope to have a good supply of most things on the price list (see below). The Veggie Membership is one of our core markets and the one that responds best to the bio-diversity of crops which we enjoy. Some years, green beans do well, but in other years (like 2009) the bean crop was a failure but other crops such as onions and winter squash were abundant. The 2011 season was so cold that only the cool weather crops were plentiful while 2013 was warm and pretty much everything was abundant. The last two years, we experimented with tomato grafting. Our initial trials were successful. With the additional benefit of propane heat, you should be receiving greenhouse grown beefsteak tomatoes in your bags in the later weeks of the season. (Stay tuned, or follow us on facebook @organicfarmnl for details on our experiments with tomato and eggplant grafting, and new projects including fruit trees, melons, and okra!)

What if I don't want a particular vegetable or herb?

All bags have the same products. We bring a swap box to each MUN pickup, so members can swap an unwanted item for another item of similar value. This usually works out well since people prefer different things. Members can also buy extra produce out of the swap box rather than swapping vegetables. We call this Tail Gate Sales. We cannot be as flexible with farm pickups. However, we do post packing slips, containing a list the products delivered that evening, by 5 PM on the farm website. If a member who picks up at the farm checks the packing slip, wants to swap or buy extra vegetables, and e-mails on Wednesday evening, we can put their name on a bag that contains the desired swap or extra items for Thursday or Friday pickup.

What are the payment options?

Payment options are explained on the membership application that appears below. Payment may be made by cheque (single or series of post-dated) or by e-transfer. You can opt to pay the total membership fee at the beginning of the season. This helps cover our labour costs early in the season. To show our appreciation, we **offer a 5% discount** to Large and Small bag members who pay the **total fee by May 15** (i.e., Smaller Bag - \$518.70, Larger Bag - \$678.30).

When and where are deliveries? Pickup options?

Deliveries will be on Wednesdays (the first delivery will be either on June 19th or June 26th). Bags must be picked up between 6 and 6:30 PM in the Science Building Parking Lot at MUN.

You can opt to pickup bags (advance notice) anytime after 6 PM at the farm (42 Churchills Road, Portugal Cove). Pickups at the farm can also occur a day or two later than the delivery day. Arrangements around holidays, swap box, and pickup are the same as last year and are reviewed for new members.

RETURNING MEMBERS: PLEASE RENEW BY MAY 15!

Welcome back! We look forward to seeing you at the first pick-up. Please return the membership form (provided below). You can use the **reply** button on your e-mail program to respond directly to the e-mail. If there are no changes from last year, simply put your name on the form. If there are changes in bag size, phone numbers, payment schedule, who you are sharing with, address, or place for pick up, please indicate this. We look forward to connecting again – at the Science Building or the farm. **Not returning?** If you have not already let us know, please send a short e-mail to that effect.

NEW MEMBERS

The first step is to complete the membership form below. (Note – just fill in your name if you already have sent us a form.) Be sure to indicate your preference: large bag, small bag, part-time large bag, or part-time small bag.

WHAT ARE MY CHANCES?

If you would like to have a full season membership, reply to this e-mail as soon as possible. We will try to

accommodate everyone who applies.

PART-TIME MEMBERSHIP

To accommodate people who plan to be away for more than 3 weeks this season, we offer both small and large bag part-time memberships. Please check the weeks you would like to have a veggie bag on the **part-time application that appears below**. Part-time members can subscribe to 3 or more weeks and must prepay (with 1 to 3 cheques). The part-time pricing is based on the average cost of either the small or large bags delivered on each of the weeks during the 2016, 2017, and 2018 seasons. In general, the bags delivered later in the season were larger and will cost more. Since we were able to offer members more vegetables than the subscription cost in each of these three seasons, the weekly costs are about 10 percent more expensive than a full season membership.

IF MEMBERSHIP COST IS A BARRIER!

Perhaps you are a returning member and have an income loss since last year. This has happened to other families. We have spaces for a limited number of people to help at the farm, to reduce fees or to actually barter a full fee. Whether you are a returning member or a new member and unable to afford the full fee this year, please get in touch with Mike by e-mail. We may be able to partially subsidize the costs.

WHAT YOUR INVESTMENT IN THE VEGGIE GROUP MEMBERSHIP MEANS!

When you buy a Veggie Group membership you are supporting an ethical organic farm that has provided employment for many people over the years. We provide mentoring opportunities for people from around the world through a farm stay program. Part of our farm mission is to provide a place where old and young people can visit to see and learn about growing organically. Mike volunteers his time on Saturdays between 11 and 5 at the farm giving free consultation to anyone who comes to learn how to use organic methods for their own gardens.

In 2008 and 2009, we hosted over 500 school children, who visited the farm to pick and taste veggies. In 2010, we helped the children at Bishop Field Elementary School make the world's largest salad for Health week in September; along with donating salads for the Eastern Edge Art Marathon and other healthy eating campaigns. Our son Oz did some "organic farm" teaching at St. Andrews elementary school the past three years; as a result the students/teacher have developed a garden on the school grounds.

Each year, students enrolled in the chef training course at the College of North Atlantic visit the farm with their Instructors to look and taste. People enrolled in a skills and employment program, offered through various community agencies such as the MacMorran Community Centre, frequently visit the farm as do dozens of community garden groups. We have provided mentoring for high school students from St. John's. The students came on Saturdays to work with Mike, then put these skills to work in a community garden where they grew food for a local food bank. Several are now growing their own food.

The relationships we have built over the years with our many CSA customers is an important aspect of our history. The Veggie Group is a large, extended family of people who have become friends of the farm. As a member of the Veggie Group, you are helping with a collective effort that is much larger and more significant than the food we grow and the food you take home. You are part of an investment in the organic movement toward a healthier environment and a healthier life style for everyone. We continue to hope to encourage enough farmers and individuals to grow food so that Newfoundlanders can rise above 9% self-sufficiency in food production. By doing so, healthy foods can be available to everyone and we can reduce the rates of obesity and diabetes that are reported to be the highest in Canada.

OUR GARDENING CENTRE

Our Gardening Centre will be open on Saturdays from 9 am. to 5 pm. (Please call ahead if the weather is bad, 895-2884). We invite you to bring your family or friends to the farm on Churchill Rd, Portugal Cove to see where your food is growing. If your friends are back yard gardeners, please let them know, they can order edible flowers, herbs, vegetable seedlings and organic supplies through our web-based service or come out to the farm to see what is available. Follow the links to the seedling order form on our website at http://www.theorganicfarm.net/ Any size order can be picked up at the farm. We do not deliver seedling orders under \$100 at the Farmers' Market. However, we will bring in lettuce, herb, Cole crop, Latah tomato, and pepper seedlings that can be purchased at our vendor table.

The Organic Farm grows assorted herbs, such as basil, cress, coriander, dill, curly and flat leaf parsley, several kinds of mint, oregano, rosemary, tarragon and thyme. We supply Veggie Group members with herbs as they become available including basil and herb bouquets (sample of 3 to 5 herbs). Members can order additional herbs, such as basil, by special order if we have an adequate supply. We also provide tips on drying and freezing herbs.

Occasionally, other specialty items are added to the weekly collection of veggies and herbs to add interest, for example, edible flowers, recipe samples or recipes such as Tabouli with core ingredients. Members can also exchange these items for basic veggies as available if they wish.
